During the present year, no new work has been executed at Fair Mount, the time of the workmen having been chiefly occupied in keeping up "the Distribution," extending the iron pipes, and repairing the damages caused by the great ice-freshet on the night of the 26th of January last, which increased the water ten feet two inches perpendicular on top of the Dam, and twelve feet three inches above high tide in the river below the Dam. It completely inundated all the pumps and machinery; by its great pressure, forced open the doors, and considerably injured the partitions, floors, and other work in the mill-house; broke and destroyed upwards of three hundred feet of the planking on the face of the Dam and Ice-breakers, and swept from the upper part of the Dam, upwards of twenty thousand yards of rubble-stone backing. On the west side of the river, the canal was entirely overflown with water and masses of ice, eighteen inches thick: a number of hoats lying in the canal for a safe harbour, were carried over its embankments, and swept away

with the stream. At the Permanent Bridge on High Street, the water rose eighteen inches above the mark of the freshet of 1784; at Gray's Ferry, it carried off the floating bridge, and swept from their bases two of the stone piers, and part of the wooden structure of the new viaduct bridge belonging to the Baltimore Rail Roal Company; the great velocity of the water and ice at this contracted point, deepened the river sixteen feet,

where the land pier of the bridge formerly stood.

The repairs which this calamity rendered necessary, induced the Committee to postpone the completion of other work of less importance, in order to have the Dam, Ice-breakers, Forebays, and mill-house repaired previous to the coming winter. Although the freshet was one of the most disastrous kind, the wheels and pumps were in operation in less than twenty-four hours after it had subsided; at that time there was still remaining in the reservoirs, water sufficient to supply the City and Districts for four days.

Deeming this a good opportunity for the examination of the main structure of the Dam, the Committee, in accordance with the Resolution of Councils on that subject, appointed Henry R. Campbell, Josiah White, Daniel Groves, and Frederick Erdman, Esqrs., who, after a full survey, were of opinion, that the repairs suggested by Mr. Graff would put it into a safe condition for the present; but they recommend a renewal with some alterations, in 1840 or 1841, of that part which is exposed above the tide, as stated in their report laid before Councils in Sep-

tember last. The system of gradually extending the iron pipes and fixtures has been pursued in sections of the City where water was required, chiefly west of Broad Street; one mile of pipes has been laid this season, which, added to those laid in former years, makes the whole quantity 62 6-8 miles. These, with the pipes laid by the Districts, 47 1-8 miles, make the whole quantity 109 7-8 miles, which extend from Fair Mount to beyond the Navy Yard in the District of Southwark, and northward to the Glass Factory in the District of Kensington. From the circumstance of the workmen being employed in the repairs of the Dam, &c., the levelling of the grounds outside the enclosures of the reservoirs has been partially suspended: 9585 perches of stone have been taken away from the bluffs on quarry-leave, and a considerable quantity of dirt and stone has been removed by James M. Bolton, under contract; the sum received from said contract and for the stone, has been paid into the Treasury. During the ensuing summer, it is supposed that the ravine on the City property south of Coates' Street, will be filled up (free of expense) by persons whose lots in the vicinity are too high; after which, this plot of ground may be improved by planting trees and forming gravel walks, if approved by Councils.

The details of the Works embraced in former reports, leave but little to add at present. In closing the Report for the year, the Committee takes pleasure in remarking, that the anticipated results of its predecessors have been fully realized, and it is believed that no other City in the Union can boast of so liberal a supply of water at so economical a rate, or so effectual in times of conflagrations.
