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## ANNUAL REPORT

of THE

TO THE

SELECT AND COMMON COUNCILS OF PHILADELPHIA.

The Watering Committee respectfully present to Councils their Annual Report, and Accounts for the year 1844.

In the estimate for 1844, the sum of eight thousand dollars was included for the erection of a Turbine Water-wheel and Pump; proposals having been received for the execution of this work, your Committee, on further consideration, deemed it expedient to suspend the building of the Turbine-wheel in order to obtain a more decisive opinion of that kind of power from those who were about erecting such wheels. Since then, two large "Turbines" have been put in operation on the Lehigh River, they are said to work exceedingly well; but from the necessary geering required to adapt these wheels to pumping, your Committee have concluded to abandon the erection of a Turbine, and recommend, as the most certain and economical plan, the construction on the present cast iron shaft, No. 1, a wheel and pump similar to Nos. 7 and 8, which have been in use daily since they were set to work in August, 1843, without repairs: The cost, with the renewal of the stone-sheet-
ing, etc., will not exceed the sum appropriated last year for the proposed Turbine.

During the season, the lot on the south side of the reservoirs has been laid out with gravel walks, sodded with grass, preparatory to the planting of trees next spring.

The wharf property, and other repairs necessary for the protection of the works, have been completed.

Six thousand six hundred and eighteen feet of iron pipes of $3,4,6,12$ and 16 inches, have been laid during the summer, principally in the southwestern section of the city.

A considerable balance, of the estimated amount of expenses for 1844, will remain in the Treasury, in consequence of the sum cstimated for the erection of a Turbine-wheel and Pump not having been applied, and from there being fewer applications for the extension of iron pipes than was anticipated, and a decrease in the expenses for repairs in the year 1844.

The iron pipes put down this season, and those laid in former years, amount to 350,940 feet, being nearly $66 \frac{1}{2}$ miles; these, with $38 \frac{1}{2}$ miles laid in Spring Garden, Northern Liberties and Kensington, and $15 \frac{3}{4}$ miles laid in Southwark and Moyamensing together, amount to $120 \frac{3}{8}$ miles. There are in the city 547 fire plugs, in the upper districts 370 fire plugs, and in the lower districts, Southwark and Moyamensing, 181 fire plugs-together 1098 fire plugs.

From the early part of August to the middle of October, the Schuylkill river, like most strcams, was exceedingly low, and although the demand for water for the use of the City and Districts exceeded that of former years, no difficulty or inconvenience occurred in keeping the reservoirs constantly full.

The communications received by Councils from the commissioners of Spring Garden, Northern Libertics and Kensington, declining the use of the Schuylkill water, from and after the 31st of December, 1845, referrcd to the Watering Committee, are, with other matters connected with the subject, held under consideration; when adjusted, will be noticed in a future report.

In conformity to the Resolution which passed Councils, July 7th, in relation to supplying the District of Southwark and Moyamensing with water, your Committee report that they have made contracts agreeably to said Resolution, with said Districts for the term of ten years.

In conclusion, your Committee are pleased to state that the works under their charge are in good order. Although the water

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rents will be reduced by the three Districts having declined taking the water from the City, it will leave a surplus of water which can be well applied for manufacturing purposes in the City, and Districts of Southwark and Moyamensing.
