To the Select and Common Councils of the City of Philadelphia:

The Watering Committee respectfully present to Councils a brief account of their proceedings, with a statement of the expenses; the income arising from the Works during the last year; with an estimate of the amount required for the year 1839, viz:

By examination of the expenditure for the last eight years, it will be found that the averaged expenses per annum, will amount to 59,511 dollars, while the estimate for the present year is 28,000 dollars. The increased expenses of the former was owing to the expensive work, which is now completed, viz. erection of new water-wheel and pumps, building additional reservoirs, and the extending the iron main in Broad street, which were deemed essential, owing to the increased supply of water necessary for the City and Districts. In the estimate for 1839, the Committee only propose expending that which is necessary to continue a full supply of water, levelling and regulating grounds north and south of Reservoir, and laying such pipes of conduit as the income will justify.

Upon examination of the account of income arising from the sale of Schuylkill water, for the year 1838, it will be perceived

that the balance of \$2230 62, due and payable by the Township of Moyamensing on the 1st day of June last, has not yet been paid: the Watering Committee have notified the Commissioners of the Township, that unless the same shall be paid to the City Treasurer, on or before the 26th instant, that legal measures will be taken to obtain it, and the provisions of the agreement enforced.

The twenty-inch main mentioned in the last Report, has been laid in Broad street, from Chestnut to Cedar street. The pipes formerly put down in the intersecting streets (which were supplied with water from other sources) have been attached, which has given a more regular supply of water to the City and adjoining Districts; the length of the new main is 2700 feet; 9103 feet of pipes of 3, 4, 6, 10 and 12 inches diameter have also been placed in different streets; making the distance of pipes laid this year 11,803 feet, to which add those laid in the City in former years, makes the total 326,128 feet, upwards of 61 6-8 miles. These, with the pipes laid by the Districts, 44½ miles, make the whole quantity 106¾ miles, extending into the District of Southwark from the City line about 5000 feet; into the Districts of the Northern Liberties and Kensington about 7000 feet.

The Fountain ordered by Councils to be placed in the Franklin Square, in August, 1836, has been finished with plain jets. The marble basin and other parts of this structure is designed to admit of a statue of Franklin and other ornaments, whenever Councils may deem it expedient to make appropriations for that purpose; the sum appropriated for the fountain was 5000 dollars. An iron railing, which at first was not contemplated, but found necessary to protect the work, was put up, causing an excess in this item of \$379 64.

At Fair Mount, the northern and eastern banks of the Reservoirs are finished. Several hundred trees have been planted around them, and in the enclosures on Fair Mount and Coates street.

The Dam has been strengthened by additional backing with rubble stone, and a new ice-breaker built at the guard pier on the west side of Schuylkill. The necessary repairs have been done to the mill buildings, and it is believed that the Works are now in such condition as to withstand the severity of winter.

An early and unusual drought commenced in June last, which continued until the 10th of September, during which time the river became very low, and on the 2d of September had fallen so as to leave the top combing of the Dam entirely dry; after the destruction of the Fair Mount Bridge by fire, which happened on the night of the 1st of September, it was used as a common foot passage, until the water rose again; during the drought,

the increased consumption of water in the City and Districts required the pumps frequently to be worked upwards of twenty hours in the day. Had the water in the pool fallen a few inches lower, it would have become necessary to alter the gates, so as to admit of working the water-wheels undershot. This circumstance is mentioned, in order to show the necessity of preventing if possible any interference with the water in the pool at Fair Mount, for objects not embraced in the special contracts made with the Schuylkill Navigation Company.

the average daily supply of water was 2,628,428 gallons,
From April 1st, to July 1st, - 3,942,642 "
From July 1st, to October 1st, - 5,151,720 "
From October 1st, to December 31st, - 3,679,800 "
Being an average, for the year, of 3,850,647 gallons; and an excess of 394,264 gallons, per day, over the supply for 1837.

The present Water Works were put into operation in the year 1822, at which time it was calculated that the wood work of the water-wheels, breastwork, gates to the mills, and forebay, would decay in about fourteen years. They have been in use sixteen years. With occasional repairs they probably will last three or four years longer, when a general renewal must take place.
